On 10/09/2009 at 1315 hours, I and other officers responded to New Hope Street between Belvoir and Plymouth Road for a report of a w/m wearing a light blue shirt and khaki pants with a male child. The male was reported to be wearing an exposed hand gun on his waist. Detective Lacy located the male exiting bicentennial park onto New Hope Street.

Upon my arrival Detective Lacy was in the process of handcuffing the subject for safety reasons. The male was identified as George Donnelly of [REDACTED] Norristown Pa 19401. He told Lacy and I that he was walking along with his son and had the gun, along with a pocket knife, for protection because of all the crazies out here.

Donnelly was upset that he was handcuffed and stated that we were violating his constitutional right to bear arms. He was advised that he was handcuffed for safety reasons and he would be free to leave as soon as it was verified he was legally able to carry a firearm, that he had no warrants, that he was who he said he was and that the child was indeed his son.

The son was upset and attempts to console him were met by resistance by his father. Judging by the child's reaction to Donnelly it was believed that he was his son, so no attempt to remove the child from his father was taken.

The hand gun, a black GLOCK .40cal with a serial number of [REDACTED] was removed from his holster and unloaded. A record check revealed that the gun was registered and licensed to Donnelly and he also had a Montgomery County concealment permit. However, a permit was not needed in this case because Donnelly was clearly carrying the gun in an open view manner.

Sergeant Michael Bolinsky, Detective Jeff McGee, and Lt. Jeff O'Brien arrived on location. I maintained possession of the gun, Lt. O'Brien was given the ammunition, and McGee the ammunition clip.

A record check on Donnelly produced negative results for past criminal history or warrants. The handcuffs were removed and Donnelly was advised that he was free to leave the area.

I returned his gun, Sgt. Bolinsky returned his knife and we cleared the area. Lt. O'Brien and Detective McGee remained on location with Donnelly. No further action taken by this officer.
