

# Human rights come from your liberty.

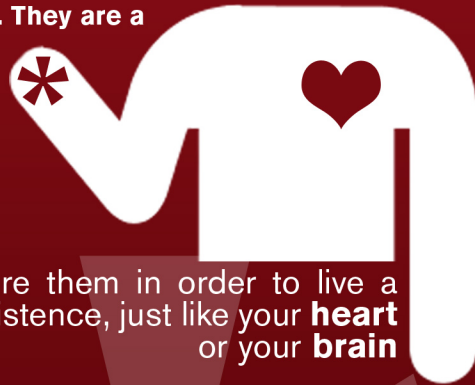
You have a right:

*This behavior comes from an irrational desire to control you. He doesn't need to control you to sustain his life.*

# SUPER-HUMAN RIGHTS

**✗ There is no path to super-human rights.**

$$* * \div \text{2 people} = 1 \text{ set of rights}$$

2 million divided by 2 million also equals 1. **Still equal.**
